*EfVET organised the second INNOVET Training Event which took place from May 3 to 5, 2022 in Lyon, France.*

The event was hosted by SEPR (Société d'Enseignement Professionnel du Rhône) and attended by about 60 practitioners from all partners' organisations together with 20 from Western Balkans and relevant stakeholders.

The seminar was conceived to boost the collaboration among the EfVET Thematic Teams involved in the project, namely Internationalisation & Learning Mobility and Industry and Technology 4.0 in VET, giving them the possibility to experiment new formats of collaboration and learn from each other.

Members of these two Thematic Teams organised working activities, presented success stories and held workshops aimed at generating new synergies among them.

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## Collaborative approach to be ready for the future skills needed

At the INNOVET Training Event organised by EFVET and hosted by SEPR in Lyon, France, partners from Da Vinci College and YSAO College presented two ways to collaborate in colleges during one of the workshops.

The first way was focusing on regional stakeholders, the second on collaboration between colleges in developing international strategy and activities.

First the way YSAO from lisalmi is working with the partners in the region was explained. They organise a meeting on a regular basis where the companies and the college staff meet to discuss the future. What are the trends, what kind of competences are needed and how can the college react on this need?

In a collaboration like this, trust is crucial. *“It is a matter of trust, apparently it is not the ‘normal situation’ that colleges and companies are on the same table”.*

In Vocational Education this should be normal, but this seems not to be the situation. So, it is essential to work on that and establish good relationships.

Also, it is important to make sure you have a common understanding of the terms used.

They created a Regional Forecasting team: partners and stakeholders, they collect and analyse data. In ‘round table sessions’ educational institutes, companies, municipalities and associations discuss the data and translate this into practical guidance for education and training providers.

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## The second INNOVET catalogue of best practices

Following the three-day event from last 3rd to 5th of May 2022 with a presentation of the best practices collected by the INNOVET partnership - internal or external to it - we are designing a document which constitutes the second INNOVET catalogue of best practices.

The catalogue is a very structured document where some basic information can be found, such as the organisation and country where the good practice has been implemented and the main theme/area of intervention. This can be about VET 4.0 or Internationalisation. In addition, main objectives, target groups addressed, main activities necessary for its realisation, and results achieved will be described in it.
